Jesus' Church

- "I will build my church" (Matthew 16:18, NIV)
- "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. 32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32, NIV)

Baptism is Proclaimed by Jesus' Authority

 "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20, NIV).

Jesus Proclaims Baptism to Nicodemus

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council. 2 He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him." **John 3:1-2, NIV**

Jesus Proclaims Baptism to Nicodemus

3 In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."

4 "How can a man be born when he is old?"
Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!"

5 Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. 6 Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. 7 You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.'"

(John 3:1-7, NIV)

Scriptural Baptism, Proclaimed, Preached, Passed On & Powered by the Spirit!

- Proclaimed by the Authority of the Lord in the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20)
- Preached by Jesus to Cornelius (John 3:1-7)
- Passed on to Peter from Jesus, "the keys to the kingdom" (Matthew 16:19).
- Preached by Peter at Pentecost (Acts 2:36-41).
- Powered by the Spirit; the active agent in baptism? (1 Corinthians 12:13).

The Real Question?

- The question is NOT if you want to be baptized!
- The question is DO YOU want to see the kingdom of God?

Do you want to see the kingdom of God?

- Then you have to be born again!
- You have to be born of water & the spirit!
- You have to loose your sins!
- You have to receive the Spirit!
- This same promise is for all!
 - The Jew
 - The children of the Jews
 - For all whom our Lord will call

Accept the Message & Enter the Kingdom

- Those that accepted the Lord's message were added to the church at Pentecost 2000 years ago!
- The message has not changed!
- Would you, friend, see the kingdom of God?
- Then as Ananias proclaimed to Saul of Tarsus, "Arise, be baptized and wash away your sins, calling upon his name!" (Acts 22:16, NIV)
- Come, to Jesus; be empowered by the Spirit to enter the Kingdom! Come!
