 - or drop out of school
 - and are more likely to finish college

- Simple assault rates were
 - divorced or separated was 32 per 1,000 persons.
 - persons never married, 25 per 1000

"Crimes Against Children Research Center" Survey

a project of the University of New Hampshire, initial funding provided by the US Department of Justice,
Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

- CCRC researchers conducted the Developmental Victimization Survey to gather data on a range of victimizations from birth until adulthood over the course of one year. Among the findings were:
- Just more than half of youth (530 per 1000)
 experienced a physical assault. The highest rate of
 physical assault victimization occurred between
 ages six and 12.
- One in 12 (82 of 1000) youth experienced sexual victimization, including sexual assault (32 per 1000) and attempted or completed rape (22 per 1000).
- Child maltreatment was experience by a little less than 1/7 of youth (138 per 1000). The study divided maltreatment into five categories (physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, and family abduction) of which emotional abuse (name calling or denigration by an adult) was most frequent in occurrence.

"These are the commands, decrees and laws the LORD your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess, 2 so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the LORD your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life. 3 Hear, O Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the LORD, the God of your fathers, promised you." (Deuteronomy 6:1-3, NIV)

These Commandments of Love Bring With Them The Only Real Hope & Promise ...

• "4 Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. 5 Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. 6 These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." (Deuteronomy 6:4-7, NIV)





Fathers, How do we do this?

"Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress ..." (James 1:27, NIV)

What if I were the orphan or widow(er), how would I want to be loved?

Loving Those In Need

Read: Matthew 25:31-46, NIV

- How would I want to be loved if I were hungry?
- How would I want to be loved if I were thirsty?
- How would I want to be loved if I were a stranger?
- How would I want to be <u>loved</u> if I were in need of clothes?
- How would I want to be loved if I were sick?
- How would I want to be loved if I were in prison?

Loving my enemy

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. 46 If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Do not even pagans do that? 48 Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:43-48, NIV).

Meeting Needs With Love

- Hungry, thirsty, a stranger, in the need of clothes, sick, in prison, widow, orphan, even enemies!
- This is far more than simply meeting an apparent need...
- It is the meeting the need and a matter of the heart of a person that needs to experience LOVE...
- Namely, God's love through YOU!

In other words

- Involve your children in the process of loving God and loving others!
 - Nursing home visits
 - Ministering to family, friends, neighbors
 - Ministering to our widows
 - Taking food to the hungry
 - Purchasing good clothes for the needy
 - Even in ministering to enemies

In other words

- Harmful decisions to families and society:
 - Parents saying "my children won't behave making such visits..."
 - Parents not taking the time of day to make such visits themselves to those in need...
- Strengthening the character & fabric of our nation & children
 - To make visits regularly...
 - To work together for a common cause as a family
 - To work together for a common cause as a church

 "I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me." (Matthew 25:45, NIV).

For those FATHERS who truly LOVED & taught their CHILDREN to LOVE...

"The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40, NIV)

"Dear friends, I am not writing you a new command but an old one, which you have had since the beginning. This old command is the message you have heard. 8 Yet I am writing you a new command; its truth is seen in him and you, because the darkness is passing and the true light is already shining. 9 Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness. 10 Whoever loves his brother lives in the light, and there is nothing in him to make him stumble. 11 But whoever hates his brother is in the darkness and walks around in the darkness; he does not know where he is going, because the darkness has blinded him. 12 I write to you, dear children, because your sins have been forgiven on account of his name." (1 John 2:7-12, NIV).
