1. Often we enter into a dangerous place and we <u>know it</u> by cones, fences and signs.

Self-deception is a process of denying or rationalizing away the relevance, significance, or importance of opposing evidence and logical argument.

- 2. The longer we live in the danger zone of self-deception, the more difficult it becomes to <u>see</u> the danger. We believe that it will not <u>harm</u> us, and the more convinced we are that we are right.
- 3. Things are really dangerous when we <u>don't know</u> or acknowledge we're in a danger zone.

WOULD YOU BE WILLING TO RENT THE DEVIL A GUESTROOM?

Ephesians 4:26-27 "In your anger do not sin": Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, ²⁷ and do not give the devil a **foothold**.

WHERE DOES YOUR ANGER COME FROM?

Matthew 15:1 Then some Pharisees and teachers of the law came to Jesus from Jerusalem and asked, ² "Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? They don't wash their hands before they eat!" ³ Jesus replied, "And why do you break the command of God for the sake of your tradition? ... ⁶ ... you nullify the word of God for the sake of your tradition. ⁷ You hypocrites! ... ⁸ "'These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. ⁹ They worship me in vain; their teachings are but rules taught by men.'" ¹⁰ Jesus called the crowd to him and said, "Listen and understand. ¹¹ What goes into a man's mouth does not make him 'unclean,' but what comes out of his mouth, that is what makes him 'unclean.'" ... ¹⁷ "Don't you see that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and then out of the body? ¹⁸ But the things that come out of the mouth come from the heart, and these make a man 'unclean.'

1. So your heart is responsible for your words, actions and deeds.

Matthew 15:19-20 For <u>out of the heart come</u> evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. ²⁰ These are what make a man 'unclean'; but eating with unwashed hands does not make him 'unclean.'''

- 2. So if your heart isn't in good shape, it's going to be almost impossible to maintain healthy <u>relationships</u> with anybody.
- 3. So what is in your heart is going to come out of you, regardless of who is around you.

STEPS TO GET A HEALTHY HEART:

Step 1. FILL YOUR	WITH GOD'S WORD.			
Psalm 119:9-11 How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word. ¹⁰ I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. ¹¹ I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.				
Step 2. KEEP YOUR FOCUSED 0	N PRAISEWORTHY THINGS.			
Philippians 4:8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things.				
Step 3. MAKE	A PRIORITY.			
Psalm 86:11-13 Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name. ¹² I will praise you, O Lord my God, with all my heart; I will glorify your name forever. ¹³ For great is your love toward me; you have delivered me from the depths of the grave.				
Step 4. QUICKLY	KNOWN SIN IN YOUR LIFE.			
1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.				

Confess means: Admit having done something wrong. The definition of confess in the scripture is associated with change. It is connected with restitution, repentance and restoration.

Ephesians 4:31-32 <u>Get rid of all</u> bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. ³² Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.
