## • <u>DISOBEDIENCE: JONAH 1:2</u>

Jonah 1:1-2 - The word of the LORD came to Jonah son of Amittai: <sup>2</sup> "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before me."

## • DISCIPLINE: JONAH 1:4-17

Jonah 1:9-12 - He answered, "I am a Hebrew and I worship the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the land." <sup>10</sup> This terrified them and they asked, "What have you done?" (They knew he was running away from the LORD, because he had already told them so.) <sup>11</sup> The sea was getting rougher and rougher. So they asked him, "What should we do to you to make the sea calm down for us?" <sup>12</sup> "Pick me up and throw me into the sea," he replied, "and it will become calm. I know that it is my fault that this great storm has come upon you."

## DISTRESS: JONAH 2:1

Hebrews 4:16 - Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

Jonah 2:2 – "In my <u>distress</u> I called to the LORD, and he answered me. From the depths of the <u>grave</u> I called for help, and you listened to my cry."

**Distress** means: The travail of childbirth or labor.

"Jonah, go." Jonah says, "No." Jonah gets on a ship. <u>Phase one,</u> God sends a storm. It doesn't work. <u>Phase two</u>, God sends the captain. "You need to pray." <u>Phase three</u>, the sailors have mercy on him and don't throw him overboard. <u>Phase four</u>, when they do throw him overboard, God sends a fish. <u>Phase five</u>, the fish gets a tummy-ache and throws him up onshore.

All through this miracle, you can see different phases where God was working.

Jonah 2:3-6 - You hurled me into the deep, into the very heart of the seas, and the currents swirled about me; all your waves and breakers swept over me.

<sup>4</sup> I said, 'I have been banished from your sight; yet I will look again toward your holy temple.' <sup>5</sup> The engulfing waters threatened me, the deep surrounded me; seaweed was wrapped around my head. <sup>6</sup> To the roots of the mountains I sank down; the earth beneath barred me in forever. But you brought my life up from the pit, O LORD my God.

• Never forget the "God"

Jonah 2:7 – "When my life was ebbing away, <i>I remembered you,</i> LORD, and my prayer rose to you, to your holy temple."
Jonah 2:8 – "Those who cling to <u>worthless idols</u> forfeit the <u>grace</u> that could be theirs. "

Jonah 2:9 – "But I, with a song of thanksgiving, will sacrifice to you. What I have <b>vowed</b> I will make good. Salvation comes from the LORD."
Ephesians 2:8-9 - For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of $\operatorname{God}$ – $^9$ not by works, so that no one can boast.
